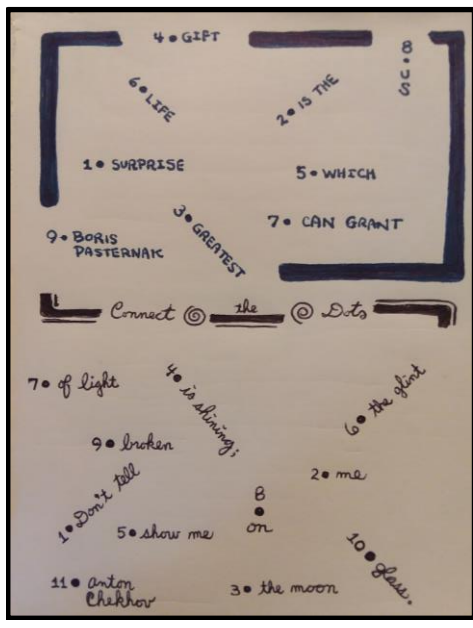

## connect the dots

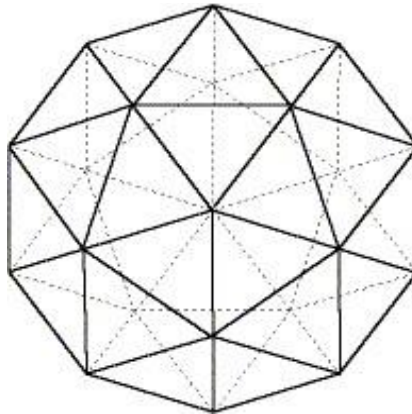

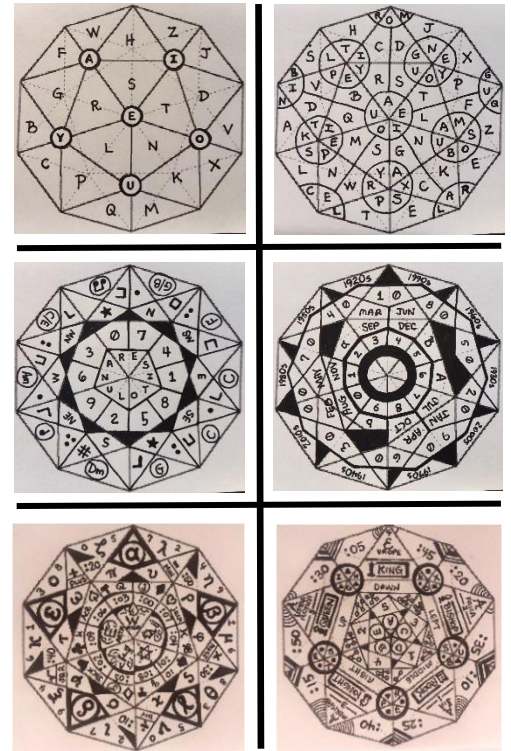


## GEODESIC CIPHERS

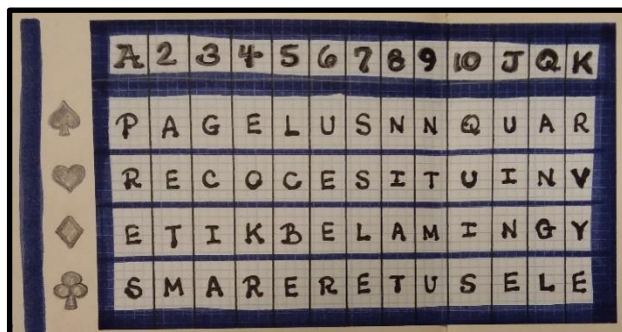


Geometric shapes such as this are fun to decorate symmetrically. What information would you encode into your pattern?

The object of Word Rummy is to build 7-letter words using runs and sets of letters from a 13x4 grid like the one shown here. Runs (horizontal) must always read left to right and stay in order. Sets (vertical) may be used in any order. For example, MARTIAN is made up of the run 2-3-4 of clubs and the set 8-8-8-8. The score of each word is determined by adding the point values of each letter (A=1, 10JQK=10). \*\* from the book Puzzlecraft by Mike Selinker & Thomas Snyder. Their best total score using the grid shown here is 1,144! \*\*
